Nominating Committee to meet Aug. 19 to nominate president-elect, secretary

he Nominating Committee of the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) will meet on Friday, Aug. 19, in New Orleans to nominate a president-elect for the 2017-18 term and a secretary for the 2017-19 term. The president-elect will automatically assume the presidency in 2018-19.

According to the president-elect rotation, the nominee must have his/her preferred mailing address in Nominating Committee District 1 (parishes of Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard and St. Tammany).

According to the secretary rotation, the nominee must have his/her preferred mailing address in Nominating Committee District 2 (parishes of Ascension, Assumption, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Iberville,

For the 2016-17 election cycle, balloting will be conducted electronically only, as has been in place since 2011. No paper ballots will be provided.

The Nominating Committee report will be submitted to the Board of Governors on Aug. 20.

On Monday, Sept. 19, notice of the action of the Nominating Committee and self-qualification forms for positions on the Board of Governors, LSBA House of Delegates, Nominating Committee, Young Lawyers Division and American Bar Association House of Delegates will be provided to the membership.

Deadline for return of nominations by petition and qualification forms is Monday, Oct. 17. First election ballots will be available to members on Monday, Nov. 14. Deadline for electronically casting votes is Monday, Dec. 12.

Other Positions Open

Other positions to be filled in the 2016-17 elections are:

Board of Governors (three-year terms beginning at the adjournment of the 2017 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the adjournment of the 2020 LSBA Annual Meeting) — one member each from the First, Second, Third and Fifth districts.

LSBA House of Delegates (two-year terms beginning at the commencement of the 2017 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the commencement of the 2019 LSBA Annual Meeting) — one delegate from each

of the Twentieth through Forty-Second Judicial Districts, plus one additional delegate for every additional district judge in each district.

Nominating Committee (15 members, one-year terms beginning at the adjournment of the 2017 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the adjournment of the 2018 LSBA Annual Meeting) — District 1A, Orleans Parish, four members; District 1B, parishes of Plaquemines, St. Bernard and St. Tammany, one member; District 2A, East Baton Rouge Parish, two members; District 2B, Jefferson Parish, two members; District 2C, parishes of Ascension, Assumption, East Feliciana, Iberville, Lafourche, Livingston, Pointe Coupee, St. Charles, St. Helena, St. James, St. John the Baptist, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, Washington, West Baton Rouge and West Feliciana, one member; District 3A, Lafayette Parish, one member; District 3B, parishes of Acadia, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Cameron, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, St. Martin, St. Mary and Vermilion, one member; District 3C, parishes of Allen, Avoyelles, Evangeline, Grant, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, Sabine, St. Landry and Vernon, one member; District 3D, parishes of Bossier and Caddo, one member; and District 3E, parishes of Bienville, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, DeSoto, East Carroll, Franklin, Jackson, Lincoln, Madison, Morehouse, Ouachita, Red River, Richland, Tensas, Union, Webster, West Carroll and Winn, one member.

Young Lawyers Division. Chair-elect (2017-18 term), nominee shall be a resident of or actively practicing law in the parishes of Orleans, Jefferson, St. Bernard or Plaquemines, based on preferred mailing address. Secretary (2017-18 term), nominee

shall be a resident of or actively practicing law in any parish in Louisiana, based on preferred mailing address. Petitions for nomination must be signed by 15 members of the Young Lawyers Division. Also to be elected, one representative each from the First, Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Eighth districts (two-year terms).

American Bar Association House of Delegates (must be members of the American Bar Association) — one delegate from the membership at large. All LSBA members may vote for the candidate. The delegate will serve a two-year term, beginning with the adjournment of the 2017 ABA Annual Meeting and expiring at the adjournment of the 2019 ABA Annual Meeting, as provided in Paragraph 6.4(e) of the ABA Constitution.

2016 Legislative Recap: Status of bills supported/ opposed by LSBA

he 2016 Louisiana legislative session brought 1,148 House bills and 471 Senate bills. Through its Legislation Committee and its Board of Governors, the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) supported 10 bills and opposed 29 bills.

Among the bills supported were SB 203 which provided for certain penalties regarding the unauthorized practice of law and SB 301 which creates the Juvenile Justice Accountability and Cost Effectiveness Act of 2016. Both bills passed.

Notable bills opposed by the LSBA included SB 374 which provides relative to the Louisiana Public Defender Fund and SB 418 which provides for payment of a fee for application as an indigent to the judicial district indigent defender fund. These bills failed.

Pay dues and assessment, file statement, file trust account disclosure online to avoid penalties and ineligibility

he 2016-17 Louisiana State Bar Association membership dues, the Louisiana Attorney Disciplinary Board assessment, the Attorney Registration Statement and the Louisiana Supreme Court Trust Account Disclosure and Overdraft Notification Authorization were all due on July 1.

Delinquency notices will be mailed the first week of August to members who have not complied. Attorneys who fail to timely pay their assessment and dues and file their registration statement and trust account disclosure will ultimately be subject to monetary penalties and certification of ineligibility to practice law, pursuant to the Association's By-Laws and the Supreme Court's Rule XIX.

Legal Specialization Update: LASC court order and recertification applications

♦ he Louisiana Board of Legal Specialization (LBLS) received notice that, on June 2, the Louisiana Supreme Court amended Rule 7.2(c)(5) of the Louisiana Rules of Professional Conduct.

The amended rule, in part, involves use of the terms "specialist," "specialty," "specializes in," "certified" and "board certified." Review the full court order at: www.lsba.org/goto/Rule72c5.

For specialists whose certification expires at the end of this year, the LBLS recognizes that this new rule may impact decisions to

maintain specialization certification. All eligible specialists have been sent an Application for Recertification form for the period of Jan. 1, 2017, to Dec. 31, 2021. While the LBLS encourages specialists to continue the recertification process, the LBLS board has determined that a specialist who withdraws his/her recertification application prior to the end of the year will receive a full refund of the \$100 application fee.

House approves 8 resolutions and elects members to committee, board

he Louisiana State Bar Association's (LSBA) House of Delegates approved eight resolutions and elected members to a committee and a board at its June 9 meeting in Destin, Fla.

Following discussion and votes, the House:

- ▶ Approved a resolution from the LS-BA's Public Utility Section to amend its bylaws to increase the number of members elected to the section council from two to five.
- ► Approved a resolution from the LSBA's Rules of Professional Conduct Committee to recommend to the Louisiana Supreme Court the amendment of Rule 1.5(f)(2), which would include additional

requirements regarding flat-fee arrangements

- ▶ Approved a resolution from the LS-BA's Legislation Committee supporting legislation that would prohibit discrimination in pay based on race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, national origin, disability or age.
- ▶ Approved a resolution from delegate Edward L. Tarpley, Jr. (9th Judicial District) urging the Louisiana Legislature to require unanimous criminal jury verdicts.
- ▶ Approved a resolution from delegate Don Paul Landry (29th Judicial District) 1) recognizing that LGBT people have a human right to be free from discrimination, threats, violence and denigration based on their LGBT status; 2) urging the repeal

of all constitutional amendments, laws, regulations and rules or practices that denigrate or discriminate against LGBT individuals; and 3) urging the adoption of laws prohibiting discrimination in employment, housing and accommodations of LGBT people.

- ▶ Approved a resolution from delegate Adrian F. LaPeyronnie III (24th Judicial District) requiring the LSBA to offer its members the opportunity to include in their online member profiles both their photographs and their legal office website addresses.
- ▶ Approved a resolution from delegate Joseph L. (Larry) Shea, Jr. (1st Judicial District) 1) opposing any legislation and government rules or regulations which would permit non-lawyers to engage in the practice of law; and 2) promoting and supporting legislation to provide remedies and access to a Louisiana forum for Louisiana consumers who are harmed by non-lawyers who sell, license or market legal services and products, including software, online solutions and legal forms.
- ► Approved a resolution from Class Action, Mass Tort and Complex Litigation Section Chair Val P. Exnicios to adopt a policy in favor of retaining LSBA representation on statewide boards, commissions and task forces.

In other business, five House members were reelected for three-year terms on the Legislation Committee: Charles C. Bourque, Jr., 32nd Judicial District; Val P. Exnicios, Class Action, Mass Tort and Complex Litigation Section; Keenan K. Kelly, 10th Judicial District; Michael W. McKay, 19th Judicial District; and Ann S. Siddall, 7th Judicial District.

Member Deidre Deculus Robert (18th Judicial District) was elected to serve a three-year term ex-officio on the Louisiana Bar Foundation's board of directors.

The House also voted to dissolve the Special Advisory Committee to Authorize the President to Speak on Behalf of the Association and refer matters to the Public Information Committee.

Focus on Access to Justice

What do pro bono volunteers and pajamas have in common?

he Louisiana State Bar Association's (LSBA) new online pro bono program allows attorneys to provide pro bono services anytime and anywhere – even at home in their pajamas. Each day, thousands of individuals with legal problems might be assisted by a short answer from a knowledgeable attorney.

A new project from the American Bar Association (ABA) will connect individuals with attorneys. Through the website, *LA.FreeLegalAnswers.org*, attorney volunteers will be able to log in whenever and wherever they like to anonymously respond to legal questions submitted by individuals who could not otherwise afford to consult an attorney. The volunteer's involvement is limited and the individual will receive sufficient help to know whether to proceed or whether it would be best to obtain the services of an attorney.

The LSBA, through its Access to Justice Department, will be responsible for recruiting volunteers to answer the online submissions and making the public aware of the services when the website launches in late August.

"LA.FreeLegalAnswers.org provides us with an opportunity to match the needs of an individual with an appropriate legal response on the continuum of services provided by Louisiana's justice community. I encourage you to volunteer," said LSBA President Darrel J. Papillion.

ATJ LIFT Collaborative Incubator Project at Family Justice Center welcomes second class

he Louisiana State Bar Association's Access to Justice Department is introducing the newest class of Legal Innovators for Tomorrow (LIFT) Fellows participating in the incubator project at the Family Justice Center (FJC). Through a collaborative project between the LIFT program, Southeast Louisiana Legal Services (SLLS) and the New Orleans FJC, LIFT Fellows are working to help address the unmet civil legal needs of domestic violence survivors.

The LIFT Incubator Project at the FJC is for new or transitioning attorneys starting their own solo, small firm or non-profit practice. During the 18-month program, incubator attorneys receive subsidized office space, support and resources. The attorneys also receive training and mentorship as they work alongside experienced SLLS legal practitioners. In exchange for the training and incubation of their practice, the participating attorneys agree to provide pro bono representation to domestic violence victims.

Initially launched in January 2015, the project began as a pilot program and, due to the success of its first class, is now an official incubator program. The inaugural class — Erica L. Andrews, James A. Graham and Nicholas J. Hite — provided legal representation in more than 550 cases, approximately 100 of which were pro bono, all within the 18-month period. Additionally, 75-100 percent of the attor-

neys' paying clients fell into the modest means category, i.e., 200-400 percent of the federal poverty guidelines. The inaugural class will remain in a collaborative environment, moving to shared office space available in the building where the FJC is located. Each attorney will "pay it forward" by mentoring the incoming class of attorneys.

This year, the program welcomes two new attorneys — Shawon J. Bernard, a recent graduate of Southern University Law Center with nearly two years of practice experience; and Coby A. Venable, a graduate of Emory University admitted to practice in Louisiana in October 2015.

"There is a great need for legal services for victims of domestic violence. The pro bono and low bono representation provided by the incubator attorneys have made great strides to increase access to legal representation," said Laura Tuggle, SLLS executive director.

"The incubator project provides a unique opportunity for new attorneys going solo soon or shortly after graduating law school to work in a collaborative environment with many agencies and organizations providing holistic services to FJC clients," said Mary Claire Landry, executive director of the New Orleans FJC.

The program still has space available for one additional attorney who is passionate about serving the unique legal needs of domestic violence survivors. Anyone interested in participating should email Amy Duncan at amy.duncan@lsba.org.
