For the 2018-19 election cycle, balloting will be conducted electronically only, as approved by the LSBA Board of Governors. No paper ballots will be provided.

The Nominating Committee report will be submitted to the Board of Governors on Saturday, Aug. 25.

On Monday, Sept. 24, notice of the action of the Nominating Committee and self-qualification forms for positions on the Board of Governors, LSBA House of Delegates, Nominating Committee, Young Lawyers Division and American Bar Association House of Delegates will be provided to the membership.

Deadline for return of nominations by petition and qualification forms is Monday, Oct. 22. First election ballots will be available to members on Monday, Nov. 19. Deadline for electronically casting votes is Monday, Dec. 17.

Board of Governors (three-year terms

beginning at the adjournment of the 2019 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the adjournment of the 2022 LSBA Annual Meeting) — one member each from the First, Fourth and Fifth Board Districts.

LSBA House of Delegates (two-year terms beginning at the commencement of the 2019 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the commencement of the 2021 LSBA Annual Meeting) — one delegate from each of the Twentieth through Forty-Second Judicial Districts, plus one additional delegate for every additional district judge in each district.

Petitions for nomination must be signed by 15 members of the Young Lawyers Division. Also to be elected, one representative each from the First, Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Eighth districts (two-year terms).

American Bar Association House of Delegates (must be members of the American Bar Association) — one delegate from the membership at large. The delegate will serve a two-year term, beginning with the adjournment of the 2019 ABA Annual Meeting and expiring at the adjournment of the 2021 ABA Annual Meeting, as provided in Paragraph 6.4(e) of the ABA Constitution.

Pay dues and assessment, file statement, file trust account disclosure to avoid penalties and ineligibility

he 2018-19 Louisiana State Bar Association membership dues, the Louisiana Attorney Disciplinary Board assessment, the Attorney Registration Statement and the Louisiana Supreme Court Trust Account Disclosure and Overdraft Notification Authorization were all due on July 1.

Delinquency notices will be mailed the first week of August to members who have not complied. Attorneys who fail to timely pay their assessment and dues and file their registration statement and trust account disclosure will ultimately be subject to monetary penalties and certification of ineligibility to practice law, pursuant to the Association's By-Laws and the Supreme Court's Rule XIX.

Note on electronic payments: Confirm with your financial institution prior to making an ACH electronic check payment. If your account is Positive Pay Protected, update the Company ID to 1000091175.

House of Delegates June 7 meeting: Resolutions approved, delegates elected

he Louisiana State Bar Association's (LSBA) House of Delegates approved two resolutions and tabled a third during its June 7 meeting in Destin, Fla., held in conjunction with the Annual Meeting. Another resolution was withdrawn.

The House also elected five members to the Legislation Committee.

- ▶ Tabled indefinitely. A resolution (originally tabled at the January 2018 meeting) was unanimously tabled indefinitely. The resolution from LSBA member Dan M. Boudreaux requested that Bylaws be amended to create a dues waiver procedure for lawyers who complete at least 20 hours of approved pro bono legal services per fiscal year.
- ▶ **Approved.** A resolution from a group of LSBA members seeking clarification on the January 2010 House of Delegates policy against granting of civil immunities was unanimously approved.
 - ► **Approved.** A resolution from

the Board of Governors to dissolve the Group Insurance Committee, assign the work to the Legal Malpractice Insurance Committee and rename the Legal Malpractice Insurance Committee to the Insurance Committee was unanimously approved.

▶ Withdrawn. A resolution from the Louisiana Board of Legal Specialization to amend the Family Law Standards to include a list of items of limited importance which may be included on the written examination was withdrawn.

Also, the House elected five members to serve three-year terms on the Legislation Committee — Thomas C. Cerullo, 24th Judicial District; J. Christopher Erny, 32nd Judicial District; C. Frank Holthaus, 19th Judicial District; Tina Louise Suggs, 24th Judicial District; and Jay Christopher Zainey, Jr., 41st Judicial District.

Public hearing scheduled for comments on LBLS Employment Law Standards, Labor Law Standards

he Louisiana Board of Legal Specialization (LBLS) will hold a public hearing beginning at 5 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 16, at the Louisiana Bar Center, 601 St. Charles Ave., New Orleans, to provide a forum for Bar members to comment on the LBLS Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards.

The resolutions of two members of the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) House of Delegates (HOD) to suspend the LBLS's Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards were approved by the LSBA HOD and the Board of Governors (BOG) at the Jan. 20, 2018, meeting. Both the Employment Law Standards and the Labor Law Standards had been approved by the HOD and BOG a year earlier at the Jan. 21, 2017, meeting without any opposition.

The HOD and BOG have now requested that the LBLS conduct further study on both the Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards, including whether a majority of affected practitioners actually support the standards, and whether concerns over discriminatory effects and unfair competitive advantages can be adequately

addressed.

Bankruptcy law certification applications being accepted through Sept. 30

he Louisiana Board of Legal Specialization (LBLS) is accepting applications for business bankruptcy law and consumer bankruptcy law certification through Sept. 30, 2018.

In accordance with the Plan of Legal Specialization, a Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) member in good standing who has been engaged in the practice of law on a full-time basis for a minimum of five years may apply for certification. Further requirements are that each year a minimum percentage of the attorney's practice must be devoted to the area of certification sought and a written

examination must be passed to demonstrate sufficient knowledge, skills and proficiency in the area for which certification is sought.

Applicants must meet a minimum CLE requirement for the year in which application is made and the examination is administered. CLE is regulated by the American Board of Certification, which is also the testing agency.

With regard to applications for business bankruptcy law and consumer bankruptcy law certification, although the written test(s) is administered by the American Board of Certification, attorneys should apply for approval of the LBLS certification simultaneously with the testing agency in order to avoid delay of board certification by the LBLS. Information concerning the American Board of Certification will be provided with the application form(s).

ATJ Developing Leadership Intern Program completes third year

he Access to Justice (ATJ)
Developing Leadership Intern
Program completed its third
year on June 22. The six-week
internship provides four rising 2L students
— one from each of Louisiana's four law
schools — the opportunity to work with pro
bono and civil legal aid providers.

Weekly programming focused on the civil legal needs of low-income people, the ways in which organizations within the justice community address those needs, and how these services are increasing the quality of life for those served. In addition, interns interacted with district court judges and experienced the work life of large firms with demonstrated histories of supporting access to justice issues in Louisiana.

Louisiana's four law schools also provided programming for the interns. Louisiana State University Paul M. Hebert Law Center and Southern University Law Center combined efforts to educate this year's interns about the legal needs of those formally incarcerated. Loyola University College of Law and Tulane University Law School provided training on implicit bias and the realities of working with low-income and vulnerable client populations.

Interns also participated in Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) activities, including an Access to Justice Commission meeting, the Pro Bono Summit and the LSBA Pro Bono Publico and Children's Law Awards Ceremony.

Adams and Reese, L.L.P., Baker, Donelson, Bearman, Caldwell & Berkowitz, P.C., Jones Walker LLP, and Phelps Dunbar, L.L.P., have been the four sponsoring law firms since the first year of the program.

Participating organizations were the Baton Rouge Bar Association, Crescent Care,

the Justice and Accountability Center, Louisiana Appleseed, the New Orleans Family Justice Center, Southeast Louisiana Legal Services, the Pro Bono Project of New Orleans and the Parole Project.

Participating judges were Judge Bernadette G. D'Souza, Orleans Parish Civil District Court; Judge Jeffrey C. Cashe, 21st Judicial District Court; Judge Timothy S. Marcel, 29th Judicial District Court; and Judge Lisa M. Woodruff-White, East Baton Rouge Family Court.

LIFT welcomes four attorneys to two Legal Incubator Programs

he Louisiana State Bar Association's legal incubator program, Legal Innovators for Tomorrow (LIFT), welcomed three new attorneys to the Domestic Violence Project and one new attorney to the Juvenile Re-Entry Assistance Program (JRAP).

LIFT addresses the legal needs of underserved and underrepresented populations in Louisiana and supports new attorneys in forming viable and sustainable public interest solo practices.

Lang Dominique Verner, Sophie Woodruff and Eleanor R. Brown joined the Domestic Violence Project in New Orleans, operated in collaboration with the New Orleans Family Justice Center (NOFJC) and Southeast Louisiana legal Services (SLLS). This program improves availability of legal services to survivors of domestic violence, particularly in the area of family law. While in the program, the LIFT attorneys receive office space onsite at NOFJC, free resources, training and mentorship from SLLS's staff attorneys. The attorneys agree to provide 30 hours per month of pro bono representation to domestic violence survivors. After 18 months, the attorneys leave the program with sustainable solo practices that will continue to serve underrepresented populations.

Trinicia S. Leonard joined JRAP in Shreveport. The program is operated in partnership with the Justice and Accountability Center of Louisiana and focuses on reducing barriers for youth (ages 18-24) who are reintegrating to their communities after incarceration. Through her

work, Leonard will provide representation in expungements, public benefits and housing law that will ultimately reduce recidivism, promote public safety and create positive results in communities in the Shreveport area. She will help host expungement legal clinics and resource fairs, in which eligible individuals who live or could live in public or Section 8 housing will have an opportunity for all expungement costs to be covered by a grant from Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Housing Authority for the City of Shreveport

he Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA), through its Access to Justice Commission, has created a "Find Legal Help" portal to connect the public with the full spectrum of legal services available in the state.

The online portal, at www.LSBA.org/goto/FindLegalHelp, includes options for hiring an attorney; identifying legal aid and pro bono programs; accessing self-help forms and resources; finding online and telephonic assistance; and searching a modest means directory of attorneys willing to provide sliding-scale fees or limited-scope representation.

The availability of legal services, particularly for people who cannot afford representation, depends on variables including the type of legal issue, a person's income, location and proximity to private attorneys and legal aid, and other factors. The "Find Legal Help" portal is designed to help all litigants find legal information and assistance, regardless of financial circumstance. For some relatively simple matters, self-help resources are available. In addition to a list of attorneys and services specific to each parish, the portal also connects to a wide range of statewide programs and informational websites. All information is available via mobile devices and those who need help accessing the website or printing materials can visit their local library for assistance.
