## Mire, Talley, Jones, Ryan nominated for LSBA, YLD leadership positions

## Self-qualifying deadline is Oct. 22

Several leadership positions are open in the 2018-19 LSBA election cycle. Balloting will be conducted electronically only, as approved by the LSBA Board of Governors. No paper ballots will be provided.

On Monday, Sept. 24, notice of the action of the Nominating Committee and self-qualification forms for positions on the Board of Governors, LSBA House of Delegates, Nominating Committee, Young

Lawyers Division and American Bar Association House of Delegates was provided to the membership.

Deadline for return of nominations by petition and qualification forms is Monday, Oct. 22. First election ballots will be available to members on Monday, Nov. 19. Deadline for electronically casting votes is Monday, Dec. 17.

The president-elect will automatically assume the presidency in 2020-21.

According to the secretary rotation, the nominee must have his/her preferred mailing address in Nominating Committee District 1 (parishes of Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard and St. Tammany).

## Other positions open

Other positions to be filled in the 2018-19 elections are:

**Board of Governors** (three-year terms beginning at the adjournment of the 2019 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the adjournment of the 2022 LSBA Annual Meeting) — one member each from the First, Fourth and Fifth Board Districts.

LSBA House of Delegates (two-year terms beginning at the commencement of the 2019 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the commencement of the 2021 LSBA Annual Meeting) — one delegate from each of the Twentieth through Forty-Second Judicial Districts, plus one additional delegate for every additional district judge in each district.

Nominating Committee (15 members,

one-year terms beginning at the adjournment of the 2019 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the adjournment of the 2020 LSBA Annual Meeting) — District 1A, Orleans Parish, four members; District 1B, parishes of Plaquemines, St. Bernard and St. Tammany, one member; District 2A, East Baton Rouge Parish, two members; District 2B, Jefferson Parish, two members; District 2C, parishes of Ascension, Assumption, East Feliciana, Iberville, Lafourche, Livingston, Pointe Coupee, St. Charles, St. Helena, St. James, St. John the Baptist, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, Washington, West Baton Rouge and West Feliciana, one member; District 3A, Lafayette Parish, one member; District 3B, parishes of Acadia, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Cameron, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, St. Martin, St. Mary and Vermilion, one member; District 3C, parishes of Allen, Avoyelles, Evangeline, Grant, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, Sabine, St. Landry and Vernon, one member; District 3D, parishes of Bossier and Caddo, one member; and District 3E, parishes of Bienville, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, DeSoto, East Carroll, Franklin, Jackson, Lincoln, Madison, Morehouse, Ouachita, Red River, Richland, Tensas, Union, Webster, West Carroll and Winn, one member.

Young Lawyers Division. Chair-elect (2019-20 term), nominee shall not be a resident of or actively practicing law in the parishes of Orleans, Jefferson, St. Bernard or Plaquemines, based on preferred mailing address. Secretary (2019-20 term), nominee shall be a resident of or actively practicing law in the parishes of Orleans, Jefferson, St. Bernard or Plaquemines, based on preferred mailing address. Petitions for nomination must be signed by 15 members

of the Young Lawyers Division. Also to be elected, one representative each from the First, Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Eighth districts (two-year terms).

American Bar Association House of Delegates (must be members of the American Bar Association) — one delegate from the membership at large. The delegate will serve a two-year term, beginning with the adjournment of the 2019 ABA Annual Meeting and expiring at the adjournment of the 2021 ABA Annual Meeting, as provided in Paragraph 6.4(e) of the ABA Constitution.

## Second public hearing Oct. 3 for comments on LBLS Employment Law Standards, Labor Law Standards

he Louisiana Board of Legal Specialization (LBLS) will hold a second public hearing beginning at 5 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 3, at the Louisiana State University Paul M. Hebert Law Center, 2nd Floor, Tucker Room, W303, Baton Rouge, to provide a forum for Bar members to comment on the LBLS Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards.

Parking is available on the LSU campus at a metered spot or in the Union Square Garage for \$1.50 per hour.

The resolutions of two members of the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) House of Delegates (HOD) to suspend the LBLS's Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards were approved by the LSBA HOD and the Board of Governors (BOG) at the Jan. 20 meeting. Both the Employment Law Standards and the Labor Law Standards had been approved by the HOD

and BOG a year earlier at the Jan. 21, 2017, meeting without any opposition.

The HOD and BOG have now requested that the LBLS conduct further study on both the Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards, including whether a majority of affected practitioners support the standards, and whether concerns over discriminatory effects and unfair competitive advantages can be adequately addressed.

The LBLS held its first public meeting on Aug. 16 in New Orleans. LBLS Chair Carl J. Servat III presided over the meeting and Board member William R. Corbett attended the meeting. The LBLS thanks LSBA President Barry H. Grodsky for his attendance and participation in the meeting and the interested members of the Bar who attended and voiced their opinions.

The purpose of the public hearings is to determine whether the LBLS Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards need to be revised based upon the resolutions passed on Jan. 20. LSBA members also may submit comments concerning the LBLS Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards to Mary Ann Wegmann by email at maryann.wegmann@lsba.org, or by letter addressed to the LBLS, 601 St. Charles Ave., New Orleans, LA 70130-3404.

In order to receive input on the Employment Law Standards and Labor Law Standards from interested members of the Bar throughout the state, the LBLS plans to hold additional hearings in Lafayette and Shreveport in 2018 and early 2019.

he Louisiana Board of Legal Specialization (LBLS) is accepting applications for certification in five areas — appellate practice, estate planning and administration, family law, health law and tax law — from Nov. 1, 2018, through Feb. 28, 2019. Also, the LBLS will accept applications for business bankruptcy law and consumer bankruptcy law certification from Jan. 1, 2019, through Sept. 30, 2019.

In accordance with the Plan of Legal Specialization, a Louisiana State Bar Association member in good standing who has been engaged in the practice of law on a full-time basis for a minimum of five years may apply for certification. Further requirements are that, each year, a minimum percentage of the attorney's practice must be devoted to the area of certification sought, and the attorney must pass a written examination to demonstrate sufficient knowledge, skills and proficiency in the area for which certification is sought and provide five favorable references. Peer review is used to determine that an applicant has achieved recognition as having a level of competence indicating proficient performance handling the usual matters in the specialty field. Refer to the LBLS standards for the applicable specialty for a detailed description of the requirements: www.lsba.org/specialization.

In addition to the above, applicants must meet a minimum CLE requirement for the year in which application is made and the examination is administered:

- ► Appellate Practice 18 hours of appellate practice law.
- ► Estate Planning and Administration Law 18 hours of estate planning law.
- ► Family Law 18 hours of family law.
- ► Health Law 15 hours of health law.
  - ► Tax Law 18 hours of tax law.
- ▶ Bankruptcy Law CLE is regulated by the American Board of Certification, the testing agency.

With regard to applications for business bankruptcy law and consumer bankruptcy

law certification, although the written test(s) is administered by the American Board of Certification, attorneys should apply for approval of the LBLS simultaneously with the testing agency to avoid delay of board certification by the LBLS. Information concerning the American Board of Certification will be provided with the application form(s).

## LSBA celebrates two-year anniversary of LA.FreeLegalAnswers.org

A.FreeLegalAnswers.org, the online pro bono program hosted in Louisiana by the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA), is celebrating its second anniversary.

On Aug. 22, 2016, Louisiana was one of the first eight states to launch a Free Legal Answers site. *LA.FreeLegalAnswers.org* is part of an American Bar Association (ABA) initiative to expand pro bono access throughout the nation; currently, 38 jurisdictions are participating.

The LSBA partners with the ABA to administer the day-to-day needs of the site while also recruiting volunteers to answer questions. The ABA maintains the software and provides malpractice insurance to all registered volunteers.

Attorney volunteers are able to log into the site whenever and wherever they like and



anonymously respond to legal questions submitted by individuals who could not otherwise afford to consult an attorney. Users who submit questions also must meet certain requirements; users must be at least 18 years of age, not currently in jail or prison, have an income within 250 percent of the federal poverty guidelines, and have less than \$10,000 in assets.

Since August 2016, 701 questions have

been submitted to the site, of which 613 questions have been answered by the 109 registered volunteers. This is an answer rate of 87 percent, much higher than the national answer rate average. On the national level, more than 38,000 questions have been submitted to the participating sites, with more than 5,000 attorneys providing responses to approximately 70 percent of those questions.

As the site continues to expand and the number of questions submitted continues to rise, the LSBA is always recruiting volunteers, particularly family law attorneys as about half of the questions submitted pertain to family law issues.

line pro bono program, and the new Modest Means Online Directory for clients who do not qualify for legal aid yet still cannot afford to hire an attorney. ## LSBA Young Lawyers Division Award Nominations Deadline: October 18, 2018

Nominations are open for the following LSBA Young Lawyers Division (YLD) awards. To be eligible for consideration, individual nominees must be a current member of the YLD (attorneys who have not yet reached the age of thirty-nine (39) years or who has been admitted to the practice of law for less than five (5) years) in good standing. The YLD Council selects award winners from recommendations made by a Committee of young lawyers appointed from around the state.

- ▶ Outstanding Young Lawyer Award. This award is given to a young lawyer who has made exceptional contributions to the legal profession and their community. In determining the recipient of this award, the YLD considers a number of factors, including: the nominee's service to the public and community, the nominee's service to the legal profession, the nominee's service to the Louisiana State Bar Association Young Lawyers Division, awards and achievements received during the nominee's legal career, challenges the nominee may have overcome, as well as specific examples of the nominee's outstanding characteristics. Present or former members of the YLD Council are ineligible.
- ▶ Outstanding Local Affiliate. This award is given to a local affiliate organization that has impacted the lives of young lawyers in an outstanding way. In determining the recipient of this award, the YLD considers a number of factors, including the organization's service to the public, service to the legal profession, successes of initiatives that serve the public and the profession, challenges overcome, creative use of resources, involvement of young lawyers in programming and services, and inclusiveness.
- ▶ Program of the Year. This award is given to an organization (bar association, firm, or other entity) that has implemented an outstanding program or service that serves the public or the profession, and enhances the lives of young lawyers or was primarily planned by young lawyer(s). In determining the recipient of this award, the YLD considers a number of factors including young lawyer involvement, impact on the public and/or profession, innovation, inclusiveness, and success.
- ▶ Hon. Michaelle Pitard Wynne Professionalism Award. This award is given to a young lawyer for commitment and dedication to upholding the quality and integrity of the legal profession and consideration towards peers and the general public. In determining the recipient of this award, the YLD considers a number of factors, including the nominee's commitment to promoting respect for the legal system and profession by exhibiting the highest standards of competence, integrity, civility, and ethics, as well as a dedication to enhancing professionalism among lawyers.
- ▶ YLD Pro Bono Award. This award is given to a young lawyer for commitment and dedication to providing pro bono services in his/her community or the state at large. In determining the recipient of this award, the YLD considers a number of factors, including the total number of *pro bono* hours per year, the impact of the nominee's *pro bono* work, ongoing contributions that have resulted in the increased access to legal services for the citizens of Louisiana.
  - 1. Please submit a type-written nomination entry, not to exceed 1,000 words, that describes why the nominee should be considered for the award and that specifically addresses the award criteria and includes, where applicable, nominator and nominee's: (a) name, (b) address, (c) telephone number, and (d) email address.
  - 2. Nominations for individual awards must include a current photo and résumé of the nominee. Additional attachments for all nominations are encouraged, which may include newspaper clippings, letters of support and other materials pertinent to the nomination. Submissions should not exceed ten (10) pages total.
  - 3. Nomination packets must be submitted by e-mail or hard copy to:

## LSBA Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson Trailblazer Award

The LSBA Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson Trailblazer Award was established in 2016. It combined two previous diversity awards — the Trailblazer Award (established in 2013) and the Human Rights Award (established in 2010). The Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson Trailblazer Award is awarded by the Association annually in June at the LSBA's Annual Meeting.

The nomination period runs from October through February.

This award recognizes individual attorneys and judges who champion the ideals set forth by Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson, the first African-American chief justice of the Louisiana Supreme Court,

who has always exhibited an unwavering commitment to enhancing diversity and inclusion in the legal profession.

Nominees must be admitted to practice in Louisiana. Judges must have been elected or appointed to a state or federal court in Louisiana; the lawyer or judge can be on active or inactive status and from any practice setting; and the lawyer or judge cannot be a current member of the LSBA's Committee on Diversity in the Legal Profession.

The Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson Trailblazer Award recipient should demonstrate a unique blend of experience, skills and accomplishments which translate into successful diversity and inclusion efforts which include, but are not limited to, the following:

- ▶ supporting and encouraging attorneys who are members of an unrepresented group within the legal profession to reach their career and personal potential;
- ▶ ensuring opportunities for the advancement of diverse people through mentoring efforts and diversity outreach;
- ► commitment to addressing issues of equality, fairness and injustice in the legal profession; and
- ▶ participation in community service activities which promote and broaden the diversity pipeline to the legal profession.

#### **Guardian of Diversity Award**

The Guardian of Diversity Award, established in 2013, recognizes non-profit groups, local and specialty bar associations, and public interest organizations that implement and advance diversity programs to promote and support diversity in the legal community. It is presented at the LSBA's Annual Meeting.

The nomination period is October through February.

Nominees can be bar associations, courts, law firms/departments, or community organizations (including non-profits and public interest organizations).

Recipients should demonstrate the following diversity and inclusion efforts:

- ► creating and implementing innovative strategies to promote and advance the concept and spirit of diversity and inclusion in society;
- ▶ making a significant impact on diversity issues in the legal profession;
- ▶ enhancing access and equality in employment, economic and educational opportunities:
- ▶ advocating and promoting an understanding and awareness of diversity;
- ▶ dedication to improving and bridging the relationship between diverse groups; and
- ▶ proven commitment to creating a culture of diversity and inclusion. ■
